

English VOCABULARY - PART ONE

Erudite (A) (erudait)

- Having or showing great knowledge or learning
- Adverb- eruditely

(An adverb can modify the meaning of a verb, an adjective or another adverb) ex. Here, there, fast, slow, often, near, everyday, almost, why where, enough

He could turn any conversation into an erudite discussion. She was very erudite

Sensitized (V)

• To make sensitive

The introductory section aims to sensitize students to the scope of the course.

Sensitization

Sensitizer (noun)

Ratchet (rāchït) (N)

- Permitting motion in one direction
- To increase or decrease by increments (toothed rack)
- SLANG-Lacking in class, refinement, or good taste

Ratchet-mouth - Some one who talks incessantly (without interruption)

Tell that ratchet-mouth to shut up!

Inure (in-yõor) (V)

- To habituate to something undesirable
- Becoming tough by habitual exposure.
- Though the food became no more palatable, he soon became inured to it.
- INURED- adjective: accustomed, hardened, toughened, habituated, desensitized.

Hyper (A)

- Having a very excitable or nervous temperament Emotionally stimulated or overexcited
- Hyperactive

Disarray (N)

- A state of disorder; confusion
- To throw in to confusion; upset, lack of discipline
- Lack of clarity

Bewilderment (N)

- The condition of being confused or disoriented
- A confusing maze or tangle

Bling (N)

- Jewelry or fashion accessories, usually made of metal or other shiny material
- Deliberately showy, ostentatious

The rapper was loaded with bling.

Rapper = a performer of rap music.

Fracas (N) (frekes)

• A noisy, disorderly fight or quarrel

= brawl, altercation, quarrel, free for all, melee, riot

• Fracas between husband and wife generally leads to divorce.

Double Whammy

- noun
- Double setback, evil spell, devastating blow

High tax rates and rise in inflation is double whammy for service class people.

Purport (V) purported, purporting, purports

- To have or present the often false appearance of being or intending claim
- To claim by manner or appearance, esp falsely

The purport of the visit was to discuss trade relation.

Deviant (A)

• Differing from a norm or from the accepted social standards of society

• A person or thing that deviates or departs markedly from the accepted norm

• A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior

Dapper (A)

- Neatly dressed, trim: very stylish in dress
- Lively and alert
- Small and active
- Small and nimble

To walk with dapper step

Cudgels (N) küjēl

- A short heavy stick; a club used as a weapon
- To beat or strike with

Take up the cudgels = to join in a dispute

Cudgel one's brains to think hard about a problem

Natty (Adj)

- Neat, trim, smart, dapper
- Smart in appearance or dress

A natty outfit, a natty uniform

Fiefdom (N)

• The estate or domain of a feudal lord

Feudal = the system by which people gave certain services eg. Military support to a more powerful man in return for lands

• An area organization or department over which one dominant person or group exercises control

Implore (V) Implored, imploring, implores

• To appeal to in supplication, beseech

Supplication = To make a humble request Beseech = To request earnestly, to beg for pardon

To make an earnest appeal

Earnest = Showing or expressing sincerity or seriousness

- To beg for urgently
- Implored the tribunal to have mercy

Chunky

- Adjective
- Short and thick
- = dumpy = short and plump
- = humpty dumpty = a short fat person

Jaunty (A)

• Having or expressing self-confident air

A jaunty grin, Walking at jaunty pace, music with jaunty rhythms, a jaunty hat, a jaunty step

Obfuscation (V) Obfuscated, obfuscating, obfuscates

• To make so confused as to be difficult to perceive or understand.

A great effort was made to obscure or obfuscate the truth.

• Making something obscure, dark
