 To struggle roughly, scuffle

Graveyard Spiral:
 In aviation, a graveyard spiral is a type of dangerous spiral dive entered into accidentally by a pilot who is not trained. It is a suicide spiral, deadly spiral

Bequeathing: (V)
 to leave or give personal property by will
 to pass to another
 to dispose of by last will

Tweak: (V)
 To pinch, twist sharply
 To adjust, fine tune
 Adjustment
 Minor alteration
 A sudden sharp pull

Time to strike the gavel

 Gavel: (N)
 A small mallet one that an auctioneer raps to mark the end of transaction
 One that judge raps to signal for order
 Raps: Hit, strike, knock, tap While the Jalan panel enables surplus payouts, it ring-fences RBI's legacy reserves from the centre

 Ring-Fence: is a virtual barrier that segregates of money protect the assets from the rest

 manage to force into or through a narrow or restricted space

 The guy looked sort of spooked.
 Frightened from ghost spirit
 Offensive slang A derogatory term for a black person

Stewing: (V)
 To undergo cooking by boiling slowly or simmering
 To suffer with oppressive heat
 To be in a state of anxiety or agitation
 Ex. In a stew over the lost keys

Miffed Zomato logs out of talks with restaurant owners

Miffed: (N)
 A bad-tempered mood, a petulant
 A petty quarrel or argument, a tiff
 To cause to become offended or annoyed

Karti's 'windfall' via share sale, asset buys during Chidambaram's tenure under lens

Windfall:(N)
 A sudden, unexpected piece of good fortune or financial gain
 Something blown down by wind, esp a piece of fruit

Bankers <u>underline</u> need to tap the <u>millennials</u>

- Underline (V)
 To emphasise, stress; to state forcibly, reinforce
- Millennials(N)
 relating to the generation born from the early 1980s
 to late 1990s
- Millennial- relating to a millennium or span of a thousand year

When push comes to shove

• When push comes to shove: Phrase When the pressure is on; when the situation is critical or urgent; when the time has **come** for action, even if it is difficult. He is not a particularly talented builder, but when **push comes to shove**, he can usually get the job done.

Shove: (V)
 To push quickly, forcefully, or roughly
 Ex. Shoved the keys into his bag

A party engaging sports drama with a sense of <u>deja vu.</u>

 Deja vu: French word seen before; no originality, a feeling of having already experienced the present situation It is a common intuitive experience I entered the room and immediately felt a sense of deja vu

He stabbed her with knife and bludgeoned her with brick before driving away.

Bludgeoned: (V) (bluj'en)
 to hit with blunt instrument, to strike with strong force

a short heavy club= a short heavy stick thicker at one end

Corruption, <u>nepotism</u> <u>reined</u> in: PM

- Nepotism: (N)
 The practice among those with power or influence of favouring relatives or friends by giving them jobs
- Rein: (N)
 A means of controlling or checking
- Rein: (V)
 To check or hold back by the use of Rein Ex: The reins of government
 Kept a tight rein on expenditure

Backlash: (N)
 a strong negative reactionary a large number of people, especially to a social or political development
 Recoil

AP HC stays order <u>nixing</u> Polavaram power project

Nix (V)
 put an end to; cancel;
 He nixed the deal just before it was to be signed

Enormity of money involved requires an indepth probe

- Enormity: (N)
 The great or extreme scale, seriousness, extent of something perceived as bad or morally wrong
 I began to get a sense of the enormity of the task
- In-depth:(A)
 Comprehensive and thorough

Ashwin's omission <u>astonishing</u>, says Gavaskar

Astonishing: (V)Greatly surprised

The leading voices of the world must be exemplars in every way

Exemplars: (N)
 One that is worthy of imitation; a perfect example or model

Government gives Beijing terse message at the meeting

- Terse: (A)
 sparing in the use of words; stating to the point; crisp
- Tersely (Adverb)
- Terseness (N)

Governments must decide on religious congregations, keep courts out.

Congregation: (N)
 A group of people assembled for religious worship

A tribute to a <u>quintessential</u> finance man, BPR Vithal's traits of professionalism, <u>pragmatism</u> & an open mind, were what made him a <u>colossus</u>

- Quintessential: (N)
 the most perfect example of a quality or class
 A refund essence or extract of a substance
- Pragmatic (A)
 dealing with things sensibly & realistically
- Colossus: (N)
 a statue that is much bigger than life size

The then PM JL Nehru <u>baulked</u> at the idea of using IAF to stem the Chinese tide

Baulked: (V)
 hesitate or be unwilling to accept an idea or
 understanding
 Thwart or hinder

Talk of unity was nothing more than a charade

Charade: (N)
 an absurd pretence intended to create a pleasant or respectable appearance

Talk gave <u>leeway</u> to India: China

Leeway: (N)
 The amount of freedom to move or act that is available
 Margin of safety
 The sideways drift of a ship to leeward of the desired course
 The government having absolute majority has greater leeway to introduce reforms

Roller-Coaster: (N)
 Something characterised by wild and unpredictable changes

Defaults became rampant.

Rampant: (A)
 Flourishing or spreading unchecked
 Unrestrained in action or performance
 A rich soil soon becomes home to rampant weeds

UK economy <u>wilts</u> as Brexit <u>jitters</u> hit business investments

- Wilt:(V)
 loss of water, become limp through heat, lose energy vigour
 confidence
- Wilt (N)
 fungal or bacterial disease of plants characterised by wilting
 of the foliage
- Jitters(N)Feeling of extreme nervousness

ITC, Patanjali <u>chart out</u> plans to give <u>haute</u> <u>couture</u> an Indian touch

- Chart (N)
 a geographical plan
 a sheet of information in the form of table graph
 Listing of the current bestselling books etc
- Haute couter (N)
 expensive, fashionable clothes produced by leading
 fashion houses
 the designing and making of haute couture clothing.
